Minimum Intervention of plantation Scot's pine. There may be potential here to thin to improve ground flora. Ground truthing required to assess where could be thinned.

Visitor zone thinning at Dog Falls car park and trails.

Visitor zone thinning at Beinn a Mheadhoin and Chisholm Bridge car parks.

Visitor zone thinning at River Affric car park and trails.


Thinning of the roadside will allow views of the loch and forest to be opened up.

All forest roads may need trees to be cut if they blow across the road or are likely to blow across the road. Thinning approval applied for all forest roads.
