Encourage native broadleaves to regenerate in the riparian corridors to benefit the wider habitat network.

Maximise commercial planting on all non-PAWS ground.

Plant Scots pine on the western edge of the butterfly reserve in clumps feathering out to a lower density west to east. This will contribute to the mosaic of open ground and native woodland within the butterfly reserve and soften the appearance of the eastern margin of the middle north arkaig block.

Restore PAWS sites on the north side of Loch Arkaig and the Dark Mile to native woodland predominately through natural regeneration, but aim to establish some areas of productive Oak woodland through planting at a commercial stocking

Continue to manage the butterfly reserve as a mosaic of native woodland and open space

Restore the native pinewoods of South Arkaig and Glen Mallie following harvesting of the current commercial crop.
