



WOODLAND

Establishing broadleaves as a main element, including in large areas along the lower slopes, which will be managed as continuous cover along with the diverse conifer species along the lower slopes. This species choice reflects the presence of diverse estate woodlands within the Tweed Valley as well as the optimising the potential of the soils and climate.

ROADLINE

Associating larger areas of excavation – such as turning points - on the most level land available, again to mitigate the impacts of excessive cut and fill

WOODLAND

Maintaining a simple species pattern with larger areas of single species on the prominent spurs


