



Increased use of mixtures where the forest is visible in the landscape.

Important open habitats maintained

Scots pine/broadleaved mix to help transition from broadleaves to conifers.

Broadleaved and open buffer alongside Lochan na Goirt, to benefit pondweed, dragonflies and butterflies

Field to be retained in agricultural use to help diversify the landscape along the A816.

Conifers removed from view from Ardfern behind low ridge.

Area restored to native woodland

Conifer species selected above PAWS areas are those less likely to seed into the area.

Native woodland and open habitat networks planned in Salachry

Scots pine/mixed broadleaved mix used down to road as per landscape architect's recommendation to give balance to the coupe above.

Conifers removed from prominent ridge top in view from Ardfern, and benefit for private water supply

Knolls highlighted with SP/mixed broadleaved mixture

Native woodland and open space along forest edge, with benefits from Black grouse and amenity.

SS/LP self-thinning mixtures used on poorer peaty sites, and where carbon positive return is expected.

Mixed and native woodland ties in with woodland outside the FCS boundary.

Bar Mor hill to be restocked with broadleaves to unify appearance across the hill in views from Loch Craignish

Native woodland habitat network corridor designed in between Old Potalloch and the entrance to Ormaig.
