The Ettrick and Yarrow Community Development Company is concerned about the future The Ettrick and Yarrow Connection of the Ettrick Marshes next to Honey Cottage Caravan Park in Ettrick. It is the largest flood of the Ettrick Marshes next to the UK and the boardwalks have been greatly enjoyed by local plain restoration project in the UK and the boardwalks have been greatly enjoyed by local plain restoration project in the residents since it was officially opened in 2002. However, it is still owned by the Forestry commission and they are concerned that the boardwalks are not up to their standard and Commission and they are to be taken out. Borders Forest Trust have given up their lease. some parts of it may note the second some of the commission for some months to see if we could buy both the Marshes and some of the commercial forest surrounding it on

If we own part of the commercial forest we can control how much of it is felled at any one time and do this is smaller lots than the Forestry Commission intend to do. We can then use the income from timber sales to maintain the Marshes as well as carrying out other projects within the community. We have now been granted some Scottish Land Fund money to engage a team of professional forestry advisors to draw up a business plan and to quantify the value of the timber in the area we want to purchase. This team is headed up by Willie Mcghee who will be known to many of you in the valleys already.

We are holding two meetings in November to talk about these plans. The first one is at the Boston Hall on Tuesday 15th November with a drop in session from 3pm to 7pm with a meeting following at 7.30pm. Willie and members of the development company will be on hand to explain what might happen and to record ideas from people about what they would like us to follow up within the forest.

The second meeting is in Yarrowfeus Hall on Tuesday the 22nd November starting at 7pm and is combined with our EYCDC AGM. Willie Mcghee will be speaking at the AGM and answering questions.
