The woodland

Glenan Wood is 146 hectares of ancient oak woodland on 'Argyll's Secret Coast' on the Cowal Peninsula in Argyll, Scotland. Sections of the woodland are marked on maps dating 1750 and 1860.

The unique habitat is rich in flora and fauna. Adders, otters, bats, deer, pine martens and water voles all make their homes here, as do wood warblers and owls. Rare lichens, moss, ferns and flowers thrive. The woodland has a rich heritage, with a number of sites including a deserted settlement and what's believed to be an old chapel.
