Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

The forest of Criffel cloaks the eastern slopes of this prominent hill south of Dumfries, and contributes to the landscape of the Nith Estuary National Scenic Area. Hill walkers regularly use the Core Path through the forest to access the summit. Most of the land is under second rotation forestry, with restructuring progressing well.

The primary objective for the plan area is to maintain productivity, whilst increasing species diversity to enhance the landscape value.
