Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

Falside is a predominantly productive plantation, situated close to the village of Chesters and the A68, four miles south of Jedburgh. Timber production will continue to be an important objective, whilst ensuring appropriate landscape design. A fifth of the forest will be managed with conservation of biodiversity as the primary objective, including Mervinslaw Wood Pasture Ancient Woodland.

Primary Management Objectives:

- To maximise fast growing conifers for sawlogs (suitable for the construction market).
- To protect and enhance the environmental opportunities including water, soils, landscape and archaeology.
- To increase the overall biodiversity value of the forest.

Secondary Management Objectives:

- Species and stand structure diversification to give greater resilience to climatic events and plant diseases.
- Maintain and facilitate current levels of recreation by the public for walking and horse riding.

Critical Success Factors

- The continued stability of the first rotation crops assigned for later phase clearfelling.
- Adequate protection for softer conifer and broadleaf species to be established
- Continued riparian zone broadleaf recruitment.
