


Feisty and familiar, the robin is the most popular bird in the UK. Make your own robin decoration with this fun activity.

you'll need ...

- THIN BROWN CARD
- A4 SHEET OF BROWN PAPER
- RED PAPER
- DARK GREY FELT TIP PEN OR PENCIL
- GLUE STICK
- SCISSORS
- 7: Trace the robin's body from the template below and cut out the shape from thin brown card (cut a slit in the body where the dotted line is – you may need an adult's help with this). Do the same for the tummy and cut it out of red paper.
- **2**: Cut out the two eyes and the two beak shapes from below. Colour the beaks in with your grey pen or pencil.
- **?**: Use your glue stick to stick the two tummy pieces, eyes and beaks onto the birds body - one of each on each side of the body. Use the picture above as a guide for positioning.

- ROCKIN' ROBIN *
 - 4: Now to make the wings for your bird. Take your sheet of thin brown paper and concertina fold it (fold it as if you're making a fan - back and forward on itself until it looks a bit like an accordion) so each strip is approx 2cm wide. Keep the paper folded up and fold it in half.
 - 5: Put the wings through the slot you've cut on the body and spread out the folds to create your bird's wings.
 - 6: Hang your bird up by some thread to create a fluttering bird decoration!



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
